Date	Topic	Strand	Additional notes
4 th September	Goal Setting	HE	Explore our own values and create sustainable goal setting.
11 th September	Growth Mindset	HE	Understand how to talk about emotions accurately and sensitively. Explore how asking questions can improve our learning in school.
18 th September	Maintaining and improving mental health	HE	Recognise the early signs of mental wellbeing issues and understand the difference between mental health and mental illnesses.
