Main purpose of marriage




Muslims consider <u>marriage to be the foundation of family life</u>. For Muslims, the purpose of marriage is:



Heather-I live with my partner and we might get married in the future. Right now, we are learning to live together, rather than getting married and then finding out we aren't compatible in that way.


